## 3. SECRETARY'S REPORT

#### Alan Cooke

#### The 2020 AGM

The 2020 AGM was held on 18th of November as an online meeting. At the meeting, and as per the minutes 3 Executive Office bearers and 8 ordinary and Committee members were elected to the AFI-Vic Committee of Management. In total we had 10 members in attendance.

#### The 2020/21 AFI- Committee

With long serving committee members Kevin Beasley, Rob Dalla Via and Adam Hassell standing down we lost a host of experience. However, with new committee members in Quinn Petrie, Ross James and Darren Colwell and the continuation of the existing Executive, we began the new year with high hopes for an active year post-covid.

The Committee has met 4 times since the last AGM. In addition, the Executive has met by phone approximately once a week over the full year. In an extremely fluid changeable year, this regular communication has ensured that the various activities of AFI (Vic) have been able to progress smoothly, adapting quickly to the many challenges that have been presented but still deliver value to members.

#### The 2021 Program

We began developing a full program of activity at our usual December Planning meeting. The plan was to continue with the proven formula of alternating presentations and site visits. As has become standard in recent years, we have worked closely with ADCA when developing the Program so that we either have activities of interest to both groups or at least do not clash with each other's activities.

We began the year with an online presentation giving an update on industry training. This was followed by an excellent Legends night with the induction of Jim Artso and Kuno Brautigam, which had been carried over from 2020. The site visit to AMAERO and then Stegbar were equally well attended. From there lockdowns took their toll. Over the past 12 months AFI (Vic) have had 2 face to face presentations, 2 site visits and 4 online presentations. Our resilience was sorely tested by the ongoing pandemic, though we continued to have strong attendance for all online presentations. With AFI(WA) also offering online presentations, there was a diverse range of topics on offer throughout the year.

#### 2021 Membership

This year our individual membership stands at 61 financial. These members represent 29 companies. AFI (Vic) have inducted a total of 24 Legends to our Hall of Fame with another nomination to be inducted on Wednesday 17/11.

#### 2022 Program

Planning for the 2022 Program will begin in earnest at our December meeting. It is likely that we will again offer a combination of presentations (either live or online) with site visits. We'll again co-ordinate with our partner organisations (AFI(WA), ADCA, MA). Our aim is on the quality of events rather than the quantity. We are always open to feedback, queries, questions or comments on how we can improve the program and add value to you and your organisation.

#### 4. President's Report – Amber Maxwell

2021 continued to send challenges our way as Victoria moved in and out of Lockdowns throughout the year, achieving the infamous reputation of becoming the world's most lockdown city throughout the Pandemic thus far.



We continue to work towards increasing and improving Training options for our Apprentices, finishing the year with 9 active apprentices actively engaged in training.

Earlier in the year the National Sub-committee successfully rejuvenated and uploaded the "All NEW" AFI National Website, officially launched in July and the feedback and uptake of new members continues to reflect the positive outlook and attitude we have collectively to the ongoing growth and development of the Metal Casting Industry. AFI are proud to have also completed our promotional video - also available on the Website - to educate, enlighten and entice those looking for a vibrant, progressive and ever changing sometimes challenging employment opportunity to explore and consider what the Metal Casting industry has to offer.

During the past 12 months we have managed to host a variety of live and online presentations and celebrated the induction of our 2020 and 2021 Legends as well. Once again in the face of adversity you - our members have rallied, and our industry has prospered.

**Alan Cooke (Secretary)**, Another stellar year of support, leadership and unwavering dedication from Victoria's official Secretary also, AFI National President. He has achieved so much for the Metal Casting Industry not only on a State level but also at a National level. Alan has held court with various politicians representing both Victorian and the National interest regarding training education, power and energy cost and carbon emissions issues. Alan also produced the Industry Report v3.0 distributed in October, without this much of the progress achieved in the many and varied areas of our industry association will simply not have occurred.

**Murray Brown (Treasurer),** At the risk of repetition Murray continues to be AFI Vic's rock. No words are left to say that have not already been shared. On top of the expansion of his paid working role and that of AFI Vic's treasurer, Murray significantly contributed to the rework and development of the Moulding and Metal Casting Apprenticeship program. Murray along with Scott Thomas have worked through the existing program and added, deleted and edited as required to be sure our RTO – GOTafe, are instilling into our future industry leaders, managers and executives the vital knowledge our progressive and critical industry requires.

**Melting Moments** has expanded this year as we have regularly received contributions from many other states. This has truly become the National Industry publication and massive thanks goes out to Darren Colwell who diligently chases up the quarterly contributions, collates and edits, what seems to be effortlessly, our quarterly, eloquent, informative and interesting edition together, ready for distribution to all members and associates nationally.

#### **Foundry Training**

Much progress has been made in expanding the program first set out as we look to encourage and inspire new apprentices and employees to join our ranks. In December we have a meeting, FiaB demonstration and foundry walk through with a local Technical college - the only one we believe left in Victoria to introduce their students Year 10 and onwards to the exciting and interesting opportunities our industry offers. It is our hope and that of the college that they could become a feeder institution for our Victorian apprentices.

#### Worksafe Review of Foundry Compliance

During the last part of 2019 Worksafe advised that there was a review taking place of the current Foundry Code of Compliance. A draft was to have been distributed with feedback requested prior to finalising and issuing of the updated Code. This was due to be finalised mid-year, however progress has also been delayed as a result of COVID-19. Thank you to those who submitted feedback on pre-draft requests.

#### **Industry Report 3.0**

This year our very own Alan Cooke has once again worked closely with many foundries nationally to compile our Industry Report.

Yet another casualty of covid was the roll out of AFI Victoria's FiaB. Whilst we have been doing some trialling and work behind the scenes in preparation for an official launch in February/March 2022.
