3. SECRETARY'S REPORT Alan Cooke

The 2022 AGM

The 2022 AGM was held on 8th of December in conjunction with the 2022 planning meeting. At the meeting, and as per the minutes 4 Executive Office bearers and 7 ordinary and Committee members were elected to the AFI-Vic Committee of Management. In total we had 11 members in attendance.

The 2021/22 AFI(Vic)- Committee

With long standing committee member, Wolfgang Maier, moving into the vacant executive role of Vice-President and new committee members in Matthew Pinczes and Sean Boswell we began the year with a renewed focus on delivering high quality activity for AFI membership. Work pressures with change of business ownership soon resulted in a reluctant withdrawal of Quinn Petrie from the committee. This left us short on numbers but on not on quality and commitment. All committee members contributed to our activity in a variety of ways throughout the year.

The Committee has met 4 times since the last AGM. In addition, the Executive has had regular contact over the year, to ensure that the various activities of AFI (Vic) have been able to progress smoothly. As with every year, there is always late changes to programmed activity to respond to, ongoing activity to retain and expand metal casting training, the quarterly newsletter, development and use of Foundry In a Box, efforts to connect with political decision makers and now 2023 Conference planning. These and more ensured that the committee had much to do – this in the context of all our businesses being extremely busy.

The 2022 Program

The 2022 Program began with a Robotics Fettling presentation at the Village Green, followed by a Geelong based presentation relating to the collaboration between a secondary school, the Geelong Manufacturing Council and Backwell IXL. As good as this presentation was, the finest moment of this night was the 100th Birthday celebration of AFI Legend Bill Pratt. The planned activity in April fell through with no time to deliver an alternative. The Victorian developed Foundry In a Box (plus video) was well received at the Brisbane National Conference. We then had a series of very interesting activities beginning with Industry 4.0 at Swinburne, a site visit to Arrow Bronze, then a presentation from Adam Hassell on the newly formed business of Quicksand, producing sand printed solutions to your moulding or coremaking issues. AFI(Vic) were represented at the traditional Technologists Picnic at Sovereign Hill , followed by an impressive site visit to Staetite Fasteners.

2022 Membership

This year our individual membership stands at 63 financial. These members represent 30 companies. AFI (Vic) have inducted a total of 25 Legends to our Hall of Fame with another nomination to be inducted on Wednesday 19/11/2022.

2023 Program

Planning for the 2023 Program will begin in earnest at our 7th of December meeting. It is likely that we will again offer a combination of presentations (either live or online) with site visits. The jewel in the crown will be the National Conference in October. We are always open to feedback, queries, questions or comments on how we can improve the program and add value to you and your organisation.

As another AFI AGM rolls around and the AFI VIC 2022 Annual Report is due for distribution it prompts me to take time for reflection and review. This past year we have had the opportunity to celebrate and recognise



some special members (and Legends) of our Industry. By the same token we have also sadly said goodbye to some of our member companies in Victoria, New South Wales and South Australia.

This year we have produced a new Video promoting our very own Foundry In a Box. This was a well received surprise for some from other States when we officially premiered it at the 56th AFI Annual National Conference in Brisbane in May. What a cracker of a conference that was – we all certainly walked away "Thinking about Tomorrow" and how we can continue to make our industry (and businesses) continue to grow and remain relevant. Great work - AFI QLD Committee.

Through the AFI(Vic) 2022 Program, we were lucky to have some of our members open their businesses doors and allow many of our members to gain an insight into what their business do and just how they do it (well almost)! These tours are always well attended and big thanks to all who allowed us to visit and also to those who attended.

Our industry has had its fair share of struggles this year as has many other's with Supply Chain issues resulting in delayed production, increases in costs of raw materials and of course the continued uncertainty of, and increases in, both Gas and Electricity prices. Our National President Brett Lawrence – Intercast and Forge South Australia - has done a stellar job waving the flag both in the media (as TV star in the making perhaps?) and also representing our industry at the Energy Industry Roundtable in ACT in July.

On the flip side many members are reporting that their order books are full and, in some cases, quoting 4 -6 month lead times. So, demand for quality Australian Made castings remains strong and growing within markets in Australia and internationally.

As we look towards 2023 we are excited to be the host State for the Australian Foundry Institute 57th Annual National Conference - we are in the final stages of locking in the venue but we can say it will be in Melbourne's CBD. So block out 26 -29th October 2023 in your calendars and stay tuned for more details shortly.

- Ongoing participation in the Victorian Skills Plan where we can inform the Government on what skills gaps there are now and equally if not more important what the predicted ones are in the next 5 years and beyond.
