# 3. SECRETARY'S REPORT Alan Cooke

#### **The 2022 AGM**

The 2022 AGM was held on 19th of October in conjunction with the 2022 Legends night celebration. At the meeting, and as per the minutes 4 Executive Office bearers and 7 ordinary and Committee members were elected to the AFI-Vic Committee of Management. In total we had 11 members in attendance.

### The 2022/23 AFI(Vic)- Committee

It was with great regret that we accepted the resignation of Amber Maxwell as long standing President. Her change in employment not only took her away from our industry but also limited her availability for engagement with AFI activity. It was with great pleasure that we accepted the nomination of Wolfgang Maier as the new President of AFI(Vic). With his many years of AFI activity, knowledge of the industry and the people in it, he was well placed to be an excellent leader for AFI(Vic). We also welcomed a new committee member in Craig Evans and returning committee member, Rob Dalla Via, giving us a very strong committee – important for a year that AFI(Vic) are hosting the 57<sup>th</sup> National Conference.

The Committee has met 11 times since the last AGM, this being necessitated by the considerable planning required to host the national conference. In addition, the Executive has had weekly contact over the year, to ensure that the various activities of AFI (Vic) have been able to progress smoothly. The following comments were in the 2022 Annual Report and apply equally as much for this year - As with every year, there is always late changes to programmed activity to respond to, ongoing activity to retain and expand metal casting training, the quarterly newsletter, development and use of Foundry In a Box, efforts to connect with political decision makers and now 2023 Conference planning. These and more ensured that the committee had much to do – this in the context of all our businesses being extremely busy.

### The 2023 Program

The 2023 Program began with a panel discussion on how to attract and retain personnel in the metal casting industry. This was followed by a much needed Conference Planning meeting given the tight timeline to deliver a successful conference. The following months had 2 presentation (ManuFutures and Al/Zn Dross disposal) and 4 site visits (Backwell IXL, Hosico, DHDS, and AWBell). This focus on site visits reduced the workload for the committee, but also delivered the opportunities to take in a wide range of manufacturing niches. This opportunity was well supported by both AFI and ADCA members. The 57<sup>th</sup> National Conference was hugely successful, with high levels of registration and most importantly high levels of engagement in all aspects of the conference. This can be best summarised by the fact that every single presentation had a minimum of 90 people attending.

### 2023 Membership

This year our individual membership stands at 55 financial. These members represent 30 companies. AFI (Vic) have inducted a total of 26 Legends to our Hall of Fame with another nomination to be inducted on Wednesday 15/11/2023.

#### 2024 Program

Planning for the 2024 Program will begin in earnest at our 6<sup>th</sup> of December meeting. It is likely that we will again offer a combination of presentations (either live or online) with site visits. For several years we have worked closely with ADCA, having many joint activities. This relationship is again expected to be reflected in the 2024 Program.

And another year comes to an end, but what a year it was. We organised a highly successful conference at short notice, with a brilliant selection of papers – thanks to Gary Savage for arranging it all and keeping all the speakers in line. The venue was very good, but with the high enrolment proved to be a little on the small side, I have never seen so many people coming in to listen to the lectures, for many of them it was standing room only and we had 90 seats in the room.

We also farewelled some people this year, in particular one of our legends, Jim West.

Through the year, we had a full range of monthly meetings that were well attended, in particular the meeting at Deep Hole Drilling and AW Bell – however the visit to the Brewery after the factory tour at Bell might have contributed to the numbers. Thanks to all the company's that allowed us to tour, it is always appreciated and if you know of anywhere we could visit, please see one of the committee members.

It looks like COVID is now mainly behind us, and supply chain and shipping issues are clearing up. Prices for most Raw Materials are also on the way down and are predicted to come down more in the future. Order books continue to be full, which looks good for the year ahead, but with interest rates continue to raise to combat inflation, there might be some harder times ahead.

Our apprentices are now with AIE and government funding has been transferred. We are all hopeful that with this change, training will be easier and better delivered.

Alan Cooke (Secretary) - Another year of extra hard work, always volunteering to attend various Industry and Training meetings, our lead in Foundry in a Box demonstrations, compiling Melting Moments and so much more. Thank you.

Murray Brown (Treasurer) - Again for this year, Murray ensured we remained on track, looked after the finances for the AFI and the conference. Thank you.

Amber Maxwell (Vice President) - What can I say, Amber worked tirelessly all year, putting out an amazing amount of work to keep us on track for the conference, putting together Melting Moments and generally helping out everywhere. She also keeps throwing up new ideas to ensure we old guys don't get too stale. Thank you.

Finally, a special mention to Gary Savage who organised all the speakers for the conference, kept them in line and made sure they did not go overtime. Well done Gary.

With the closure or suspension of the AFI SA and WA branches, it shows how strong the AFI Vic branch continues to be. This is because of all members - not just the Committee, but all of you. Please continue to support the AFI so it will be around to support and represent your businesses into the future.

Planning for the 2024 meeting calendar will be next month and all are welcome to contribute, I would like to see as many of you there as possible.


