

Funding decisions will be informed by the Skills Plan. AFI(Vic) are represented on the Industry Advisory Group – Manufacturing (IAG-Mfg.).

The many manufacturing industries represented in this body have agreed to work together to achieve mutually beneficial training outcomes.



AFI(Vic) is also building stronger links with our RTO's – GOTafe and AIE (Australian Institute of Engineering). The latter is providing engineering trade courses all over Australia including recently added MEM31719 - Certificate III in Engineering -Casting and Moulding Trade.

AIE partner with various industries, offer formal training, short courses, excursions, and webinars to enhance the student experience.

After a long and hard-fought battle with cancer Terry lost the fight on Saturday 16th October.

Terry had been a supporter, and stalwart of the Australian Foundry Industry for decades. His grit, drive and determination were like no other. Terry was well known amongst his peers for seeing and pursuing opportunity where others did not.

One of the best descriptions of Terry was delivered at his Legends presentation.

"You will always find him in bib and brace overalls, red faced and sweat on the brow, (or on the forklift) overseeing the daily schedule.

Terry's dream was to secure the long-term future of the foundry industry and to support his employees (*perpetually viewed as his extended family*) who have supported him throughout his career and to those new employees who have served the industry

From small beginnings, Terry grew his business into a large diverse group of companies with 70+ employees, supplying and manufacturing consumables and castings for customers.
