# **Apprentice Training**

Development of the next generation of skilled tradespeople is essential for our metal casting industry. Without doubt it can be difficult for a business to make the commitment to search for, employ and then retain apprentices.

Hasco Foundry has made this investment in the future and have added a Moulding apprentice to the cohort of apprentices being trained by GOTafe.

As with most things in life, apprentice training isn't as straight forward as we'd like. The governing body for national qualifications – IBSA – last year proposed changes that impact on the Patternmaking qualification. This has implications for the Patternmaking apprentices that have been enrolled prior to this change. Though IBSA have granted some extension for the old level qualification, our training providers (GOTafe and SkillsTech in Qld) will need to consider the impact of the proposed change. We're in the process of getting more detail to understand what exactly needs to be done and the timeline for doing it. We'll also seek better consultation from IBSA in the future!!

Meanwhile AFI(NSW) – potential of 10 to 12 apprentices - and AFI(WA) – potential of 6 apprentices - are keen to progress apprentice training with GOTafe. Great news for our industry.
